Brain Injury Identity Cards

Headway-produced brain injury identity cards are now available to brain injury survivors receiving support from Headway Groups and Branches. During a trial of these cards, Headway received very positive feedback from survivors who were able to produce the cards in shops etc to secure greater patience and understanding.

The card is free-of-charge and the application can be made by a brain injury survivor or somebody else can apply on their behalf. The following are needed:

- A photo of the survivor.
- · Verification of the brain injury.
- Confirmation that the survivor receives support from a Headway Group/Branch.

Headway UK's training department is planning a number of training courses which will be free to attend for Headway survivors, carers and volunteers.

- Communication Difficulties after brain injury

Concussion Aware Campaign
